Virginia Marantidou is a program coordinator in the Asia Program, at The German Marshall Fund of the United States (GMF) in Brussels. She coordinates the Brussels and Europe-based activities of the Asia Program, including the [Japan Trilateral Forum, Brussels](#), as well as China-related projects such as the [Stockholm China Forum](#).

Prior to joining GMF, Marantidou had been working at Pacific Forum, CSIS. In 2013, she was a non-resident fellow and a Young Leader, focusing on security issues in the Asia-Pacific. From 2014-15, she worked as a resident fellow at Pacific Forum, CSIS.

Marantidou lived and worked in China for almost two years (2010 to 2013), and she has studied Mandarin at Hunan Normal University, under the Chinese Government Scholarship. She has cooperated with various international relations institutes in Greece and also worked as an editor at the International Relations and Security Network, ISN, Zurich. Marantidou has also worked as a business consultant for Greek firms engaged in the Chinese market. Her articles have featured in the *National Interest*, *Asia Times*, *RealClear Defense*, and *Japan Times*. Marantidou holds a B.A. in International and European studies, Panteion University, Athens; and a MSc in Asian politics from the School of Oriental and African Studies (SOAS), University of London. She speaks Greek, English, French, and Mandarin.
